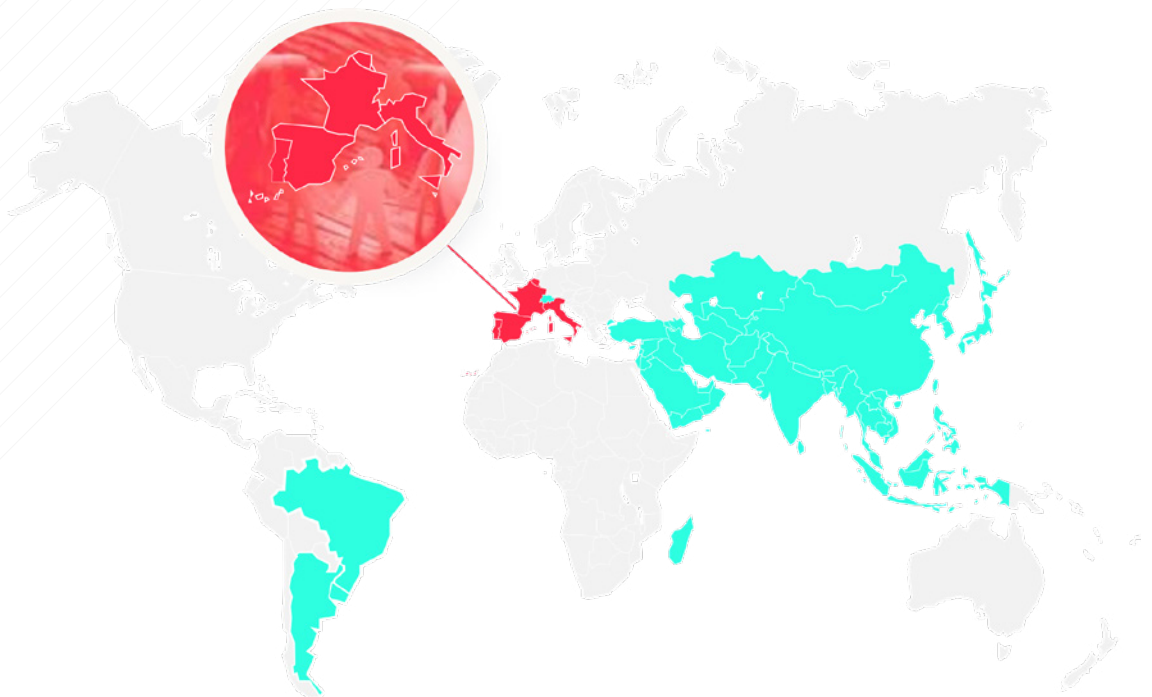

## QUESTIONS FOR GUILLAUME RIMAUD, PRESIDENT OF THE INDOSUEZ FOUNDATION IN EUROPE

### What were the main challenges faced by the foundation this year?

Like many philanthropic foundations, we faced a significant increase in the number of requests for support this year. This situation posed an operational challenge for our teams, who had to maintain high-quality work in the face of substantial demand. This phenomenon is a direct consequence of the funding cuts that the nonprofit sector was hit hard by in 2025. These difficulties led us to deeply reflect and reconsider some of our approaches.

### What actions did this lead to within the foundation?

We convened a strategic committee to redefine our orientations. This allowed us to adjust our actions to the current context and better respond to the needs of associations. We reaffirmed our commitment to supporting the inclusion of vulnerable individuals, prioritizing support for small-scale associations.

For greater clarity, we set budget thresholds and strategic priorities so that associations can quickly determine if they meet our criteria. In addition, we have evolved our support methods: from now on, we fund projects over two years with unrestricted grants. This choice reflects our trust in the expertise of the associations and our desire to offer them greater flexibility.

### What will you remember from 2025?

Beyond the points mentioned earlier, what stands out most for me is the exceptional commitment of our employees across all European entities of the Indosuez Wealth Management group. Their involvement in reviewing and advocating for projects has been remarkable, and the Executive Committee commended their diligence and enthusiasm. We also received very positive feedback from associations on the quality of our support. It is a great source of pride to see our teams combine commitment and rigor in the service of the common good.

## 03.3 HIGHLIGHTS ON A FEW PROJECTS

### THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY SERVING THE MOST VULNERABLE



#### LA JOUETTERIE: MUCH MORE THAN A NEIGHBORHOOD SECOND-HAND TOY STORE

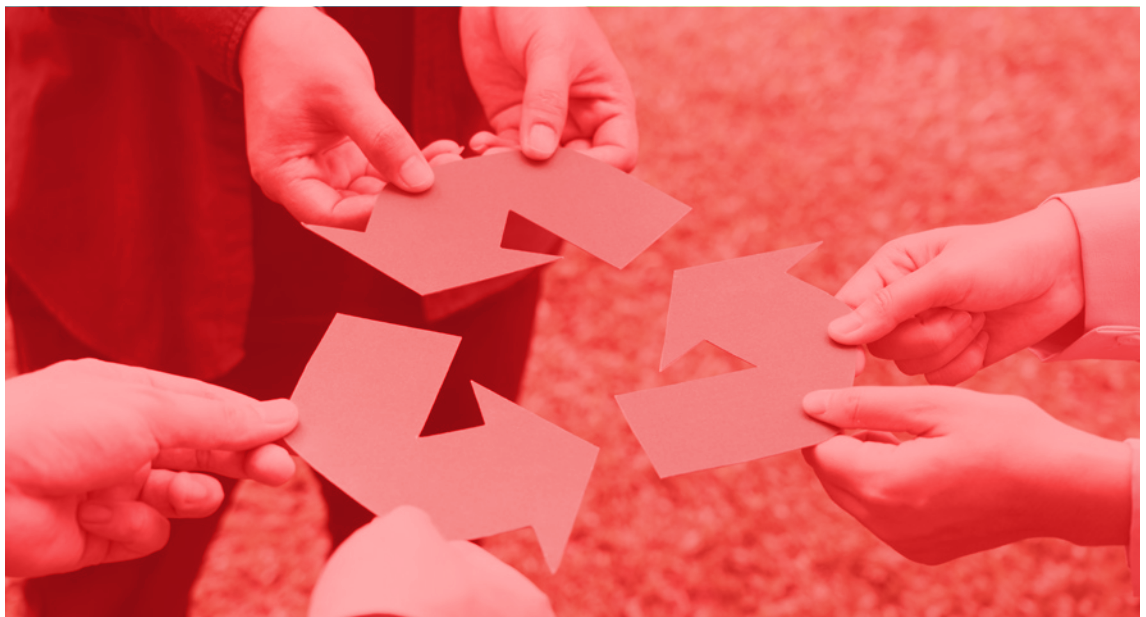
For over 50 years, the Carrefour-rue & Coulou Foundation has been providing concrete and tailored solutions for homeless people or those in precarious situations in the canton of Geneva. It offers them free meals, accommodation, hygiene facilities, as well as activities and leisure opportunities.

Located in the Grottes district of Geneva, La Jouetterie—a project run by the Carrefour-rue & Coulou Foundation—is a shop dedicated to toys and children’s clothing.

La Jouetterie’s social approach is comprehensive. Beyond collecting and redistributing toys and clothes, it supports beneficiary families through activities, leisure opportunities, and cultural events. The goal is to help them rebuild social ties, which are essential for leading a dignified life.

Recently, the foundation supported La Jouetterie by providing a grant to finance necessary renovations. The shop’s floor, which was damaged and unsuitable for welcoming young children, will be renovated to create a safe, warm, and welcoming space. These improvements will once again allow for the organization of playful and cultural activities accessible to all families.

## HOP HOP FOOD : A SOLUTION AGAINST FOOD WASTE AND FOOD INSECURITY

Hop Hop Food combats food waste and food insecurity through a digital application. It enables people in need (students, single mothers, retirees) to reserve unsold food items free of charge via the app and collect them from partner shops and restaurants. Access codes are provided by social organizations such as CROUS, Secours Populaire, or Emmaüs Connect.

For partners, the system is virtuous: it facilitates food donations, helps avoid fines related to food waste (Garot Law), and provides eligibility for tax reductions. To support the project, partner retailers also make a financial donation to Hop Hop Food, ensuring the sustainability of its economic model.

The Indosuez Foundation is proud to support Hop Hop Food in its development in the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region and to contribute to its positive and lasting social impact.

## SPOTLIGHT ON TWO PARTICULARLY ORIGINAL PROJECTS

This year, within the Indosuez Foundation in Europe, two projects stood out to us for their originality:

- The “Curasana” project, led by the association Mamás en Acción in Spain; and
- “Chaque Histoire Compte Vraiment” led by the association Ce Qui Compte Vraiment in France.

### **mamás en acción**

#### MAMÁS EN ACCIÓN - CURASANA PROJECT

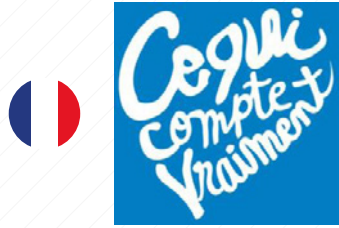
*Mamás en Acción* is a Spanish association recognised as being of public utility. Its flagship program, “CURASANA”, aims to accompany children and adolescents in hospitals who are either without parents or unable to live with them. In Spain, where over 51,000 children are the child protection system, many are hospitalized without guaranteed accompaniment during their stay. To address this situation, Mamás en Acción mobilizes 3,000 volunteers to provide affection, support, and presence 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, in more than 37 hospitals across the country.

The association supports three profiles of children: those who are victims of abuse, those from families in precarious situations, and those living in institutions. Its work, scientifically validated, helps improve the recovery of hospitalized children while preventing the emotional consequences associated with loneliness. Since its creation in 2015, *Mamás en Acción* has established itself in several major Spanish cities, with the ambition to expand its model throughout the country and then internationally.

Its main objective: that no sick child should be alone in the hospital. Their work is based on volunteerism, continuous training, collaboration with hospitals and institutions, as well as rigorous monitoring of their social impact. This project is recognized for its innovation and effectiveness, both on a human and economic level.

Its ambition? Under the slogan “#NiUnNiñoSolo” the association aims to cover all of Spain. The Indosuez Foundation is supporting them in their expansion to Majorca.





## CE QUI COMPTE VRAIMENT – « CHAQUE HISTOIRE COMPTE VRAIMENT » PROJECT

Anne-Dauphine Julliard, a journalist and writer, saw her life turned upside down by the incurable illness of her daughters Thaïs and Azylis. In 2011, she published *Deux petits pas sur le sable mouillé*, a moving account of love in the face of illness, which met with great success. Invited to Spain, she discovered the congresses of the: *Fundación Lo Que De Verdad Importa*, created by María Franco, herself inspired by reading the journal of an entrepreneur with cancer. This experience inspired Anne-Dauphine to create the association in France: Ce Qui Compte Vraiment (“What Really Matters”), to share life experiences and inspire young people to give meaning to their lives.

The “Chaque Histoire Compte Vraiment” (“Every Story Truly Matters”) project, developed by the association, offers volunteer high school students the opportunity to meet with a resident of a senior care facility each week to collect their memories and write a “life book”—a unique testimony to what has truly mattered to that elderly person. Launched in 2021, in the midst of the health crisis, this program aims to combat the isolation of seniors, strengthen intergenerational bonds, and pass on the memory of a generation. The high school students receive training, ongoing support, and present the book during a special ceremony.

Present in several regions, this project highlights the commitment of young people while restoring an active and valued role to elderly individuals. The Indosuez Foundation supports them in their expansion in the Occitanie region.



## 03.4 CITIZEN DAYS FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN IN SWITZERLAND

Volunteering days are an essential component of the philanthropic program dedicated to employees in Switzerland and Asia. Each year, more than 250 employees devote a day to supporting nearly twenty associations in these regions by participating in hands-on missions to assist them.

Because raising awareness for a more inclusive society starts at an early age, our *Citizen Days* program was enhanced in 2025 by offering employees the opportunity to get involved alongside their children.

During this initiative, employees and their children were able to choose from several activities, such as:

- Rolling up their sleeves to clean the shores of Lake Geneva, in partnership with the Association for the Safeguard of Lake Geneva (ASL).
- Supporting the second-hand store La Jouetterie by helping to label items, stock shelves, check that games were complete, or sort books.

In total, 37 employees and their children participated in the program, actively contributing to meaningful projects.

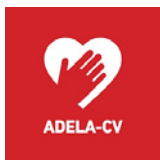
# 04 COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF PROJECTS APPROVED IN 2025

## 04.1 LIST OF PROJECTS IN EUROPE



### ARMANDIA · BELGIUM (OPHAIN)

The association aims to support children with neurodevelopmental disorders, particularly autism spectrum disorders. The Foundation funds renovation and equipment projects, notably through the creation of a sensory room.



### ADELA CV · SPAIN (VALENCIA)

The ADELA CV association's mission is to provide support and assistance to individuals diagnosed with Charcot's disease (ALS). The Foundation funds the renewal of the stock of medical equipment (*Banco de ayudas técnicas*) that can be loaned to beneficiaries affected by the illness.



### mamás en acción

#### MAMÁS EN ACCIÓN · SPAIN (MAJORCA)

The association *Mamas en Accion's* mission is to support hospitalised and isolated children aged 0 to 18 during their stay in hospital, by providing the emotional and comforting presence of a parent. The Foundation is funding the opening of a branch in Majorca.



#### ADSIS FOUNDATION · SPAIN (BIZKAIA)

The association's mission is to support people at risk of exclusion in Spain and Latin America. The Foundation is funding the renovation of the kitchen and bathroom in accommodation intended for young people leaving the care system, particularly those from migrant backgrounds.



SANT'EGIDIO

#### SANT'EGIDIO · ITALY (ROME)

The association *Comunità di Sant'Egidio ACAP*'s mission is to support people in need: the homeless, families in difficulty, children, elderly people, and migrants. The Foundation is funding part of the renovations of the iconic community centre located in the popular Garbatella district of Rome.

## 04.2 LIST OF PROJECTS IN FRANCE



### LES LIENS DU CŒUR · PESSAC (33)

Located at the heart of the cardiology department of Pessac Hospital in the Bordeaux region, the association supports and assists people with congenital heart defects and their families. The Foundation is contributing to the funding of the construction of a guest house for families.



### LÉA ASSOCIATION · DRAGUIGNAN (83)

The association's mission is to support parents of sick children by providing administrative, material, or psychological assistance to help them cope with illness. The Foundation is funding the refurbishment of the premises in Draguignan, as well as the purchase and fitting out of a utility vehicle.



### CE QUI COMPTE VRAIMENT · TOULOUSE (31)

The association combats anxiety among young people and loneliness among the elderly by pairing them for a year, during which the young person writes the life story of the senior. The Foundation is supporting the opening of a branch in Occitanie.





### LES AMIS DE FARINEZ' VOUS · PARIS (75)

The association's mission is to promote the professional reintegration of people who are far from employment through careers in bakery. The Foundation is funding the purchase of a proving chamber for their training school.



### HOP HOP FOOD · NICE (06)

The association's mission is to combat food waste by helping people in precarious situations to independently access unsold goods from shops and restaurants. The Foundation is funding the expansion of the initiative in the PACA region.



### H'UP ENTREPRENEURS · PARIS (75)

The association's mission is to promote entrepreneurial empowerment among people with disabilities. The Foundation is supporting an internal structuring project to develop a volunteer network that will facilitate expansion across different regions.



### AU FIL DE L'EAU · VAL-DE-MARNE (94)

The association's mission is to promote the professional integration of young people through its river-based integration project. The Foundation is funding the renovation of the integration boat, *Le Francilien*.



#### LA MAISON D'ADRIEN · PÉGOMAS (06)

The association's mission is to support sick children and their families. The Foundation is funding the installation of solar panels on a guest house dedicated to accommodating these families while their children are receiving hospital care.



#### L'ÉCOLE DES CUISTOTS MIGRATEURS · MONTREUIL (93)

The association's mission is to support the social integration of refugees by training them for careers in the catering industry. The Foundation is funding the digitalisation of its processes and training programmes.



#### LE VILLAGE DE FRANÇOIS · AUDAUX (64)

*Le Village de François* creates shared living spaces that bring together vulnerable individuals and their carers. The Foundation is contributing to the renovation of the Château de Gassion, which provides accommodation for people in precarious situations and young professionals.



#### GARAGE ÉCOLE DU MANS · LE MANS (72)

A member of the Fédération des Écoles de Production, the association offers free training in automotive mechanics to young people in difficulty. The Foundation is funding the refurbishment of the classroom to double its capacity, increasing from 12 to 24 places for the CAP qualification.



#### ÉNERGIE JEUNES · LA RÉUNION (974)

*Énergie Jeunes* aims to prevent school drop-out in rural and/or disadvantaged areas. The Foundation is funding the strengthening of the educational programme "On Va Tous Aimer Apprendre" on the island of La Réunion.



#### APAJH 87 · LIMOGES (87)

The association APAJH 87 supports people with disabilities, particularly those with severe autism, as well as their families. The Foundation is partially funding the construction of a new facility dedicated to their care.



#### CULTURE ÉCO · MARSEILLE (13)

Based in the northern area of Marseille, the association Culture Éco aims to establish an inclusive model of urban agroecology that promotes education and professional integration for young people and people with disabilities (ESAT). The Foundation is funding the fitting out of the kitchen within the Atelier du Goût.

### ÉCOFORMATION · MADAGASCAR

Its mission is to reduce poverty, as well as to reforest, provide access to water, and ensure food security. The Foundation is funding the production of spirulina, which is distributed in schools in southern Madagascar to combat malnutrition and, indirectly, illiteracy.

### SYIN-LU SOCIAL WELFARE FOUNDATION · TAIWAN (KAOHSIUNG CITY)

The *Syin-Lu Social Welfare Foundation* aims to strengthen the independence of people with intellectual disabilities by fostering self-determination and encouraging decision-making and responsibility. The Foundation is funding training for beneficiaries in this area.



### LES ENFANTS DU VIETNAM · VIETNAM

The association *Les Enfants du Vietnam* provides schooling and food assistance to children from disadvantaged families living in remote areas. The Foundation's funding will enable 1,000 children from the central highlands of Vietnam to receive three meals a day, allowing them to continue their education, break the cycle of poverty, and lead better lives.



### NORDESTA · BRAZIL (MUNICIPALITY OF QUEBRANGULO, STATE OF ALAGOAS)

Nordesta has been active in Brazil for 40 years, working to preserve biodiversity in close cooperation with, and for the benefit of, local communities. The Foundation is funding the planting of a new forest of 20,000 native trees and the installation of 50 hives of native stingless bees (meliponines) to promote pollination and biodiversity.



**CARITAS** Genève

### CARITAS - L'UPCYCLERIE · SWITZERLAND (GENEVA)

Caritas goes beyond its primary mission of combating poverty and exclusion with its upcycling project. *L'Upcyclerie* gives a new lease of life to materials destined for disposal and destruction, while creating employment opportunities for people in precarious situations. The Foundation is funding the acquisition of new professional tools to meet growing demand.



### LA CHENILLE BLEUE · SWITZERLAND (LA TOUR-DE-PEILZ)

Located in Switzerland, in La Tour-de-Peilz, this inclusive nursery provides care and tailored support for children with autism spectrum disorders. The Foundation is funding the purchase of suitable equipment, as well as activities for both the children and their parents.

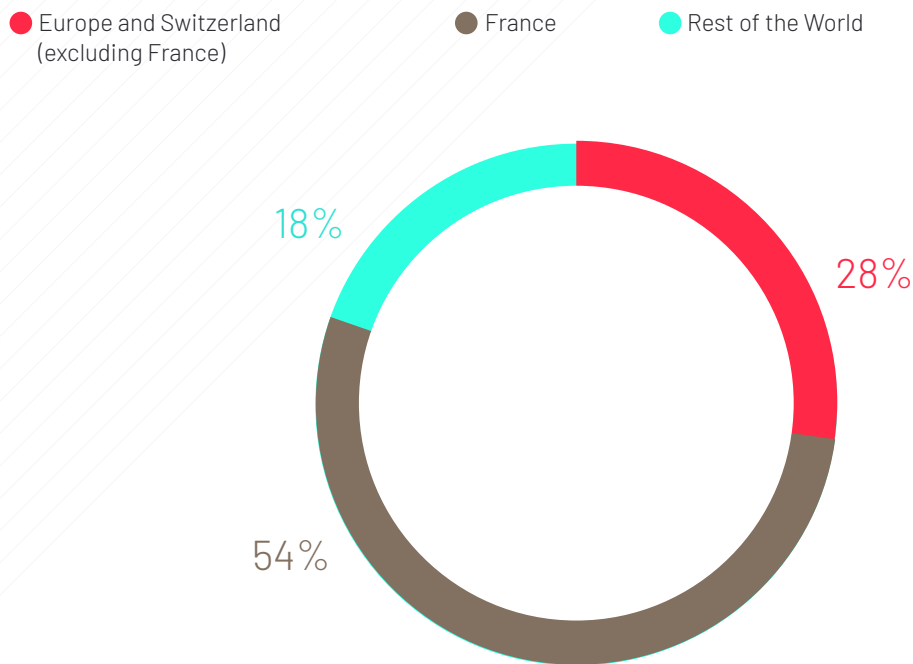


### LA JOUETTERIE - CARREFOUR RUE · SWITZERLAND

## 05.1 PERCENTAGES OF AMOUNTS COMMITTED IN 2025 BY REGION

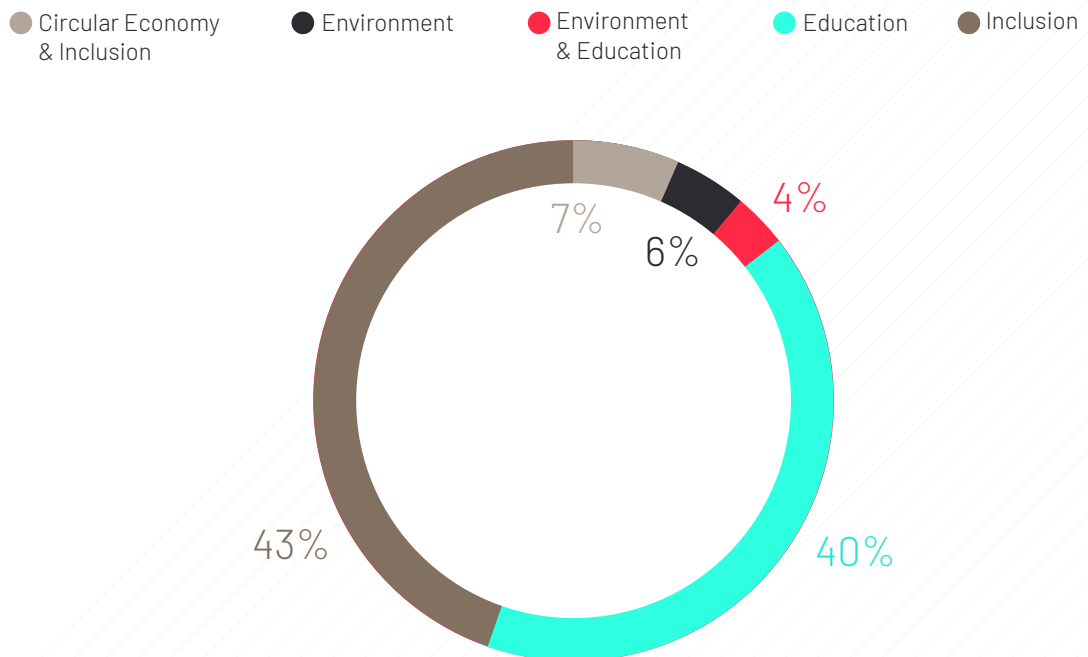
